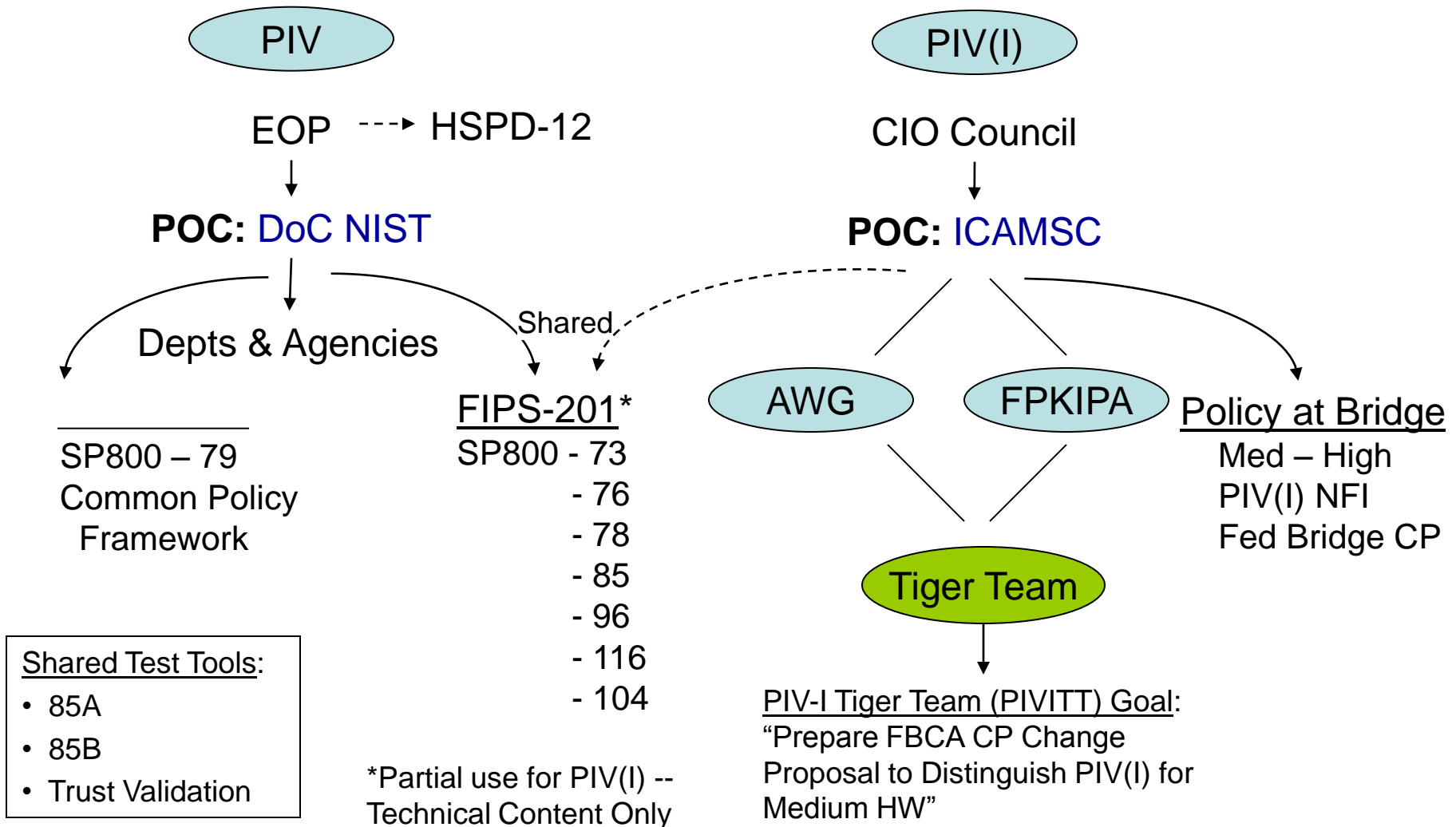

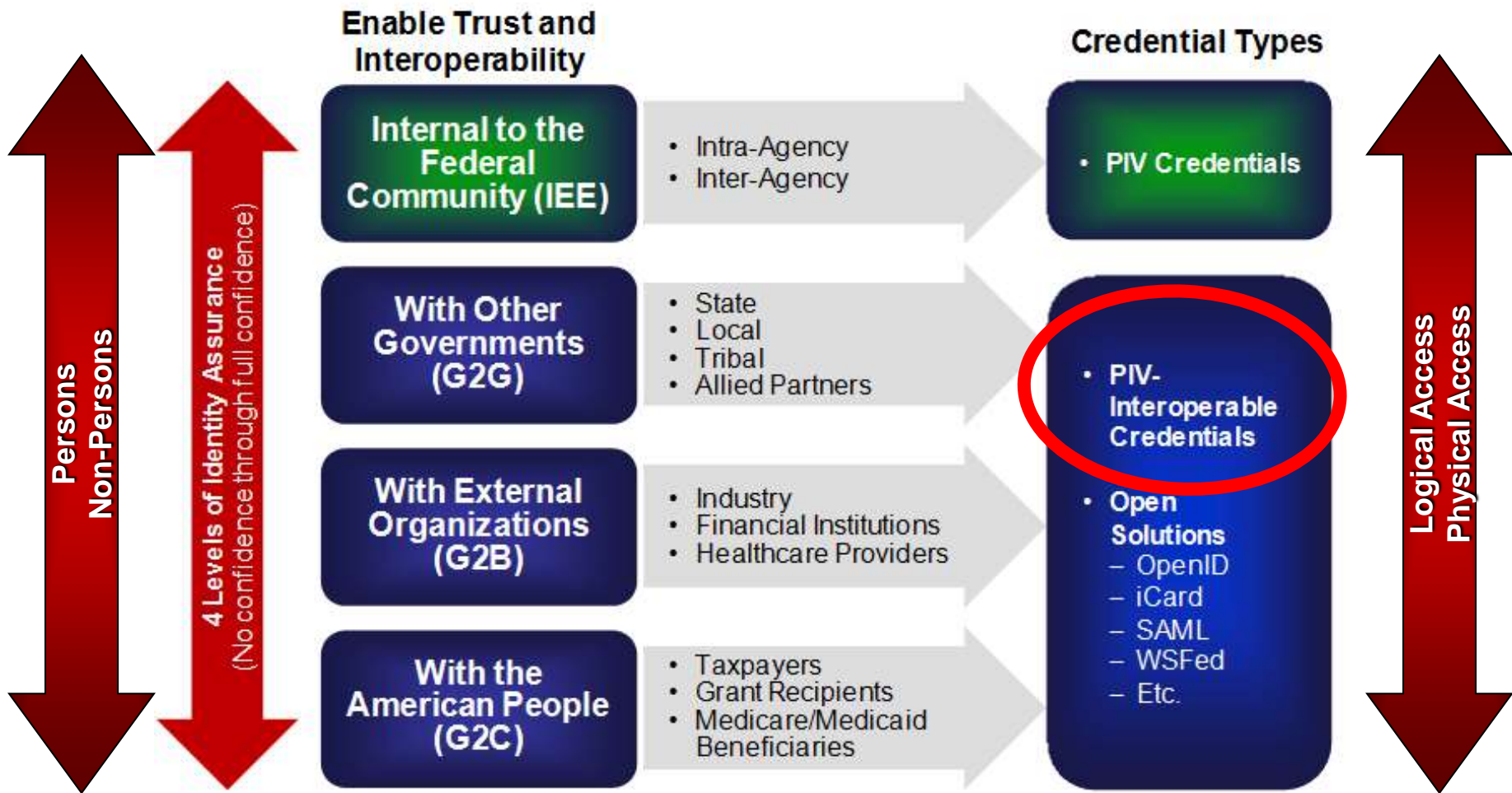

Enabling Trust – What's Different

- **Identity Proofing**
 - Identity Proofing requirement only (not suitability)
 - Based on SP 800-63 Assurance Level 4
- **Unique Identifier**
 - FASC-N is problematic for non-Federal entities
 - Use of UUID in lieu of FASC-N (See 800-73-3)
- **Digital Credentials**
 - PIV cards require Federal PKI Common Policy compliance
 - PIV-I requires trust relationship via Federal Bridge

Enabling Trust - Authentication Certificate

- Activate a PKI Digital Certificate for which a Federal Relying Party can establish a trust path.
 - The PKI Certificate issuer must have a relationship with the Federal PKI, and
 - The Authentication Certificate's policy OID/s must chain to the FBCA at Medium-Hardware or better
- *FBCA cross certification enforces the identity proofing requirements.

PIV-I “Certification”

- ICAM PIV-Interoperability Tiger Team (PIVITT) is developing a change proposal to the Federal Bridge CA Certificate Policy relating to:
 - Identity Proofing
 - Hardware Token definition
 - UUID usage information
- Several New Policy object identifiers proposed
- A set of “Frequently Asked Questions” concerning PIV-I will be released in the near future
